

Miniature Marvel: Absynthe's Workshop in a Box

What if one day you go to work and see that the workspace has shrunk? Crazy right? It sounds possible only in those sci-fi movies. But at Absynthe, the unachievable is achieved with finesse. Keeping in mind the curiosity of the visiting clients, Absynthe designed a replica of their workshop, where the real magic is created. Not often one finds a live space, bustling with various activities giving wings to creative marvels, recreated with every single detail at such a small scale that fits into a wooden box!

Let's now open the door of the box and enter the den. Right in front is the artist's desk made of wood along with a vintage chair. Once we move to what's on the tabletop, we find the replicas of some of the finished artworks and one half done. Along with it, there are tools, design sheets, antique watch parts to be used, tiny triangle trays, and more. What's remarkable is the attention given to each element to replicate the original space. Right on top are the display boards with custom-made pieces. Coming to the left is the workspace with a tiny printer and a screen joined to make it look like a computer. Detailing to the point!

How many of you like spiral staircases? Well, I loved it when I was a kid. The design gave a vintage look. And since we are in a space that is all about the past, what better than having a spiral staircase made of brass? Did you know the oldest spiral staircase dates to 480 BC in Italy? It's always exciting to climb up these stairs, so let's go up! The upstairs is where the artisans sit and give life to the designs. It gives the same vibe as, the real space. The space consists of a polishing station which has a polishing machine, tiny pink polishing papers hung on the side, and a radio with similar details to the real one in the physical workshop. Moving forward comes the artisans' desks with small green velvet cushions to sit on. The detailing is such that even the tools hanging on the wall, the tiny hammer, tongs, blow torch, compass, filers, nose pliers, and other artisan's tools can be seen on the tables. On the extreme right corner, we find a cabinet with a scaled-down gramophone.

The interior of the box is made of wood while using green canvas paper on the wall, like the real gallery. The canvas wallpaper is also in sync with the brand's abstract ideas. The miniature yellow lights are placed in such a way that the whole space looks like it came out straight from the Victorian era. It is often seen that expertly placed lighting adds another dimension to a space, bringing life to the model. The lights create the right depth and height, drawing attention to the most impressive areas. When creating such a space, it is of utmost importance to strike the right balance of light and shade to give the desired look.
